Voluntary Deportation (“3+1”) Program ng Malaysia Nakatakdang Magtapos sa August 30

Nais ipaalala ng Embahada ng Pilipinas sa Kuala Lumpur sa mga Pilipinong nasa Malaysia na ang Voluntary Deportation (“3+1”) Program ay nakatakdang magtapos sa August 30. Ayon sa programang ito, ang mga illegal immigrant na boluntaryong susuko sa Immigration Department ay maaring mabigyan ng exit pass ng Immigration Department sa pamamagitan nang pagbayad ng RM 400 (RM 300 bilang penalty at RM 100 para sa one-way pass). Hindi na sila sasailalim sa pagkabilanggo o magbabayad ng mataas na compound fee.

Para mag-apply sa programang ito, sundin ang mga sumusunod:

Step 1: Magdala ng valid passport. Para sa walang valid passport, pumunta lamang sa Embassy para mag-apply para sa travel document. Ang application para sa travel document ay maaaring umabot nang 10-15 na araw (working days) dahil sa mandatory security clearance.

Para sa mga Pilipinong nakatira sa East Malaysia, tatanggap din ang Embahada ng mga application para sa travel document sa mga susunod na lugar at petsa:

- Sabah – August 8
- Sarawak – August 12-18

Ang mga eksaktong venue para sa mga misyong ito ay iaanunsyo ng Embahada sa mga susunod na araw.

Step 2: Magbook ng tiket para sa pag-uwi sa Pilipinas. Ang petsa ng pag-uwi ay dapat nasa loob ng limang (5) araw mula sa araw ng pagpunta at pagsumite ng mga requirements sa Immigration Office.

Step 3: Pag mayroon nang valid passport/travel document at tiket, magpunta sa Embassy para kumuha ng opisyal na endorsement na isusumite sa Immigration Department.

Pagkatapos, maaari nang pumunta sa head office ng Immigration Department sa Putrajaya, o sa pinakamalapit na Immigration Office sa inyong lugar. Ang head office ng Immigration Department ay matatagpuan sa Level 4, No. [15 Persiaran Perdana, Presint 2](#), 62550 Putrajaya, Malaysia. Maaari din silang tawagan sa +60 3-8880 1298 or i-email sa pbe@imi.gov.my.

I-sumite ang kopya ng inyong passport/travel document, tiket at endorsement sa Immigration Office.

Step 4: Magbayad ng fee sa Immigration Office para sa pag-issue ng Exit Pass. Ang Immigration Department ng Malaysia lamang ang nag-i-issue ng Exit Pass. Ayon sa Immigration Department, ang halaga ng exit pass mismo ay RM400.00. Ang Exit Pass ay may validity na nasa lima (5) hanggang labing-apat (14) na araw lamang.

MAHALAGA: Kailangang makaalis nang Malaysia bago matapos ang petsa ng validity na ibinigay ng immigration office. Ang petsang ito ay makikita sa inyong Exit Pass.

Inaasahan na sa pagtatapos ng Voluntary Deportation Program sa August 30 ay lalo pang paiigtingin ng Malaysia ang kanilang mga immigration operation. Pinapaalalahanan muli ng Embahada ang mga Pilipinong naninirahan sa Malaysia na dalhin ang kanilang mga pasaporte at mga dokumentong legal sa lahat ng oras.

Malaysia's Voluntary Deportation ("3+1") Program to End on August 30

The Philippine Embassy in Kuala Lumpur wishes to remind Filipino nationals in Malaysia that Malaysia's Voluntary Deportation ("3+1") Program is scheduled to end on August 30. Under this program, illegal immigrants who surrender voluntarily can be issued an exit pass by the Malaysian Immigration Department upon the payment of RM 400 (RM 300 penalty plus 100 RM for the one-way pass), and do not have to serve jail time nor pay high compound.

Filipinos who wish to avail themselves of this program may be guided by the following procedure:

Step 1: You need a valid passport. If you do not have a valid passport, you may proceed to the Embassy to apply for a travel document. Applications for travel documents go through a security vetting clearance, which takes around 10-15 working days.

For Filipinos residing in East Malaysia, the Embassy will also receive applications for travel documents during the following missions:

- Sabah – August 8
- Sarawak – August 12-18

The exact venues for these missions will be announced later.

Step 2: Book a one-way ticket to the Philippines, where the date of departure should be within 5 days from the date of actual visit to the Immigration Department and submission of requirements.

Step 3: When you have a valid passport/travel document and confirmed booking, proceed to the Embassy to secure an official endorsement for assistance that will be submitted to the Immigration Department.

Then, you may proceed to the head office of the Immigration Department in Putrajaya or the nearest immigration office where you reside. The head office of the Immigration Department is located at Level 4, No. 15 [Persiaran Perdana, Presint 2](#), 62550 Putrajaya, Malaysia. Submit a copy of your passport/travel document, confirmed booking and the endorsement to the Immigration Department.

Step 4: Pay the required fees at the Immigration Department office for the issuance of the Exit Pass. It is only the Malaysian Immigration Department that issues the Exit Pass. According to the Immigration Department the Exit Pass itself costs RM 400. It is valid for a period of 5-14 days from the date of issue.

IMPORTANT: You must depart or exit Malaysia within the date of validity of the Exit Pass given by the immigration office. The date of validity is indicated on the Exit Pass.

It can be expected that when the Voluntary Deportation Program ends on August 30, immigration operations by Malaysian authorities may intensify and occur even more frequently. The Embassy reminds Filipinos in Malaysia to carry with them their proper identification and legal documents at all times, especially when going to public places.
